Stakeholders involved:

Survey and workshop invitations distributed to more than 30 community groups. These groups were either geographically bounded on Facebook, or in person (Communities of Place), or socially bounded (Communities of Interest).

110 survey respondents, all of which with Cambridge postcodes.

6 workshops (CB1-5 plus one at ARU), with participant numbers to be confirmed.

Patient and Public Involvement and Engagement elements:

- i) Both our survey and our deliberative workshops are with members of the public.
- ii) The workshops specifically are deliberative and will result in findings coproduced with publics.
- iii) Methodologically, we have primarily aimed to find publics where they are, rather than ask for them to come to us.

Research outcomes:

- At time of writing our data is yet to be analysed.

We will be producing a paper on our findings, as well as reporting our findings to the city council.
